#### Topic

"Brad Mangin will share tips and tricks from his 40-year career as a professional sports photographer to help you improve your sports photography. There is more to sports photography than just shooting the action. It's seeing the light, the faces, the emotion, and the details of the game, whether you are shooting Little League or the pros. Get high. Get low. Clean up your backgrounds. Mangin will cover these topics and more, including how he used his iPhone 4s in 2012 to get 6 pages of baseball pictures in Sports Illustrated and the first-ever book published of iPhone Instagrams."

#### Bio

Brad Mangin is a freelance sports photographer based in the San Francisco Bay Area. Mangin was hired by legendary sports photographer Neil Leifer as a staff photographer at The National Sports Daily in 1990. Mangin freelanced for Sports Illustrated for 25 years and accumulated ten covers. Over his career he photographed twenty World Series and five Super Bowls. Mangin's most recent book is 28: A Photographic Tribute to Buster Posey (2022). Previously, Mangin published Worth the Wait (2010); Never. Say. Die. (2012); Championship Blood (2014), and Instant Baseball: The Baseball Instagrams of Brad Mangin in 2013. He lives in Pleasanton, California, with his cats Madison and Timmy. In 1994, he founded the New Jersey Photography Forum, which under his direction, has become the largest and most recognized group of fine art exhibiting photographers in the state.
