A major focus of her work has been Vietnam, where she has documented the long-term effects of Agent Orange on families and children—work that has won awards and driven real change.

Based in San Francisco and Provence, Catherine is also a passionate educator. Her in-depth photo workshops in Vietnam-Cambodia, Romania, Provence, Puglia, and India are widely recognized for their creativity, depth, and mentorship.
